How will I be assessed?

To get your NPQ accreditation, you'll need to complete the course and pass a written assessment (between 1,500 and 2,500 words).

- > How to develop an inclusive culture
- > The identification and assessment of SEND
- > Understanding and implementation of statutory SEND legislation
